Newsletter of the Taft Family Association

May 1992

From time to time you have printed some of the history of President William Howard Taft and so I am enclosing the latest edition of our family (Taft) newsletter which may be of some use to you for your future editions. On the other hand it may not be of any interest or use to you at all and if it is not please feel free to discard it all. The Taft family settled in the small rural town of Mendon, Massachusetts (about 35 miles southwest of Boston) in 1679. Their history prior to that time is uncertain, except that their name may have previously been Taff.

Mendon is celebrating its 325th anniversary this year having been established in 1667 and the Taft family continues to have their annual reunions there each year. I have always had a personal interest in this town because some of my immediate family has remained in Mendon and I currently have two aunts and three first cousins residing there. My first cousin, David Lowell, resides at the original homesite, and the Taft marker is situated on that site. The first Tafts were Robert and Sarah, which coincidentally were the names of the late senator from Ohio and his wife.

The Ohio Tafts who include President William Howard, and Senator Robert are the most noteworthy members of the family and are descended from Alphonso Taft. The enclosed family newsletter features Alphonso's history on its first page.

There is an old Taft family cemetery situated next to the Chestnut Hill Meeting House in this town. It is purported that the village smithy next to the meeting house was where Longfellow wrote "The Village Blacksmith". Later Henry Ford moved that smithy to Greenfield Village.

There are still people with the Taft name in this town although our family name is now Lowell, which came about when my grandmother, Grace Taft married my grandfather who was Freeman Lowell. I, and my brother Rodney (June 1947), ended up at Taft Highschool because our father, Forrest T. Lowell, left the family farm in Mendon in 1919 after a stint in the Marines in World War I. After seeing some of the world with the Marines the farm life of Mendon no longer interested him and he headed for the big city of Chicago to start a new life.

I have the unique distinction of having both family names for my name. If you can use any of this information for the Taft Alumni Newsletter, please feel free to do so, and if you want the continuing history of William Howard Taft which should be in our new family newsletter let me know and I will forward it on to you when it is sent to me in about six months.





Reborn Schimpff's Confectionery marks 100 years as a Jeffersonville landmark


Dear Kay,




