Why Pay Alumni Dues?

Q. If we become Taft Alumni when we graduate, why do we have to pay dues?

A. You automatically acquire the status of "alumni" when you graduate from Taft and it is not required that you spend one cent to become a member; however, to provide you with information about various activities and other alumni, we feel it is necessary to publish a newsletter which provides all the details for you. This newsletter costs a considerable amount to publish and distribute four times a year.

A goal of the Alumni Association is to furnish a scholarship award to a deserving senior financed through special donations. Through membership dues, fund raisers and donations, we sponsor productions including "Mame" (1991), "Play On" (Fall 1991), "Bye, Bye Birdie" (Spring 1992) and "The Dining Room" (1993). Also, we have provided funds for buying hats and overlays for the marching band and a laser printer for the journalism department.

It is an advantage to have your name listed in our alumni file, so it will be available for a class reunion when one of our class members (or even you) decide to probe such a possibility. With Alumni guidelines and assistance, this venture is much easier to arrange.

As "Sponsoring Alumni" you can help make this association the largest, most responsive group of high school alumni in

the area. This shows that Taft graduates are dedicated to the school's principles and carry forth a tradition with which no other high school can compare. We got our roots at Taft and they are strong and enduring. We urge the 8,000 non-paying Taftites to join the 3,500 supporting Eagles. We are going forward with pride and determination and your financial aid will strengthen our treasury and give additional confidence to our alumni volunteers. Helping where needed, the Association has been working closely with the PTA and Local School Council for the past five years.

For the best news publication in the Chicago Public Schools the Taft Today staff received a Superior Achievement in Overall Newspaper.


