The Taft Alumni Association is run by a group of dedicated volunteers who continue to hold a special attachment to Taft, even years after graduation. The membership dues are used to cover costs of maintaining alumni records, publishing quarterly newsletters and coordinating reunion plans. We endeavor to furnish an annual scholarship to a deserving senior financed through special donations. Through membership dues, fund raisers and donations, we occasionally sponsor productions at Taft to encourage continuing interest in the drama depart-Some more recent efforts are "Mame" (1991), "Play On"" (Fall 1991), "Bye, Bye Birdie (1992), and "The Dining Room" (1993). A special drama workshop headed by a Taft alumnus and specially written play was performed by Taft students in 1994. Also, we have provided funds for buying hats and

overlays for the marching band and a laser printer for the journalism department.






