I think that just about everyone had looked back on his or her high school years and at one time or another has said, "I wonder what ever became of so and so?" Or when we met someone we went to school with its, "Do you remember the time etc., etc." Some have even married their high school sweethearts.

Having graduated in June of 1952, my 50th class reunion will be coming up. The last class reunion my wife and I attended was in 1972, the 20th reunion. As a United States Postal Inspector, in 1988, the chance came up to transfer from the Chicago office to the Phoenix Arizona office. While working a case in Phoenix in 1990, I was coming out of a store. There was a man and woman just going into the store. They both smiled as we went by a the door and said hello. I said hello back and kept on walking out. It was at [that] point the man said, "what's the matter Mac, don't you say hello to old friends!" It was John Fratzke, who now also lives in Mesa, AZ with his wife and who I had not seen since 1952. We both played football at Taft. He told me at that time about the Alumni Association and the newsletter. I went home that night and told my wife Patricia about it and she said I should follow up on it, but until now I never did.

In 1993, due to Federal Law (20 years service and 55 years ago) I had to retire. I was always going to get in touch with the alumni, but never did. In 1997 my wife passed away and again, while in Chicago for her funeral, I was going to see about the alumni at Taft, but never did.

In August of this year I was back in Chicago on family business. This time I made it a point to go to Taft myself and inquire about the alumni. What a change, from a small school that I knew, to a very big, big school with security peoples all over. My wife would be very happy that I finally did it, and so am I. It only took 10 years!

How interesting it was to read **Tom Spenny**'s (January 1958) letter (Summer 2000 TA newsletter) about the old New Hampshire Ave. school store next to the original Norwood Park School that was at New Hampshire and Hurlbut. Our family moved from Edgebrook to Norwood Park in 1944; we moved to the NW corner of Natoma and Hurlbut (5700 Natoma). At that time the New Hampshire\Hurlbut corner was vacant and remains of the old school's foundations were visible. I thought that was really "neat". Regarding your note about that old school and a Mrs. Wolufka - she taught at the Norwood Park School at Nina and Nickerson while I was there (1944-1950). She seemed "real old" then, to me, and when my classmate, **Paul Sampson** told us she

had taught his father - WOW, she had to be ancient! The fact of the matter is that Paul's dad was probably in his early 30's - e,i,.: born about 1914, so he and your dad may have been classmates at the old NPS in 1924-26. By the way, Mrs. Wolufka lived on Nina Ave - just across the street from the "lower grades side" of the school. She taught 7th grade and math, as I recall (we were in a "departmental" program in 6th, 7th and 8th grades, in those days. We moved from room to room for math, science, English, etc.) Mrs. Wolufka had a dentist son, "Charlie", with a practice in Edison Park. She was, in fact, probably only in her early 50s in the late 40s.

The letter from **Tom Spenny** (January, 1958) regarding the school store on Nagle Ave. really peaked my interest because I happened to have lived two doors down from the store! My family moved into the house in 1948 when I was 12 years old and yes, at that time the store was one of the official Taft school stores, candy store and also teen-age hangout. As a 12 year old I was quite impressed with the guys and gals that hung out there; in fact, I do believe they represented the role models for the highly successful musical "Grease" which was written by Taft graduate Jim Jacobs.

The demise of the store and a wide strip of property paralleling the south side of Bryn Mawr Ave. happened because in 1955 the State of Illinois condemned all this land for the building of the Kennedy Expressway which we well know now runs parallel to Taft. Once all the properties were vacated, the land was leveled and construction began. I hope this confirms the fact that the store on Nagle Ave. is no longer around. This does not diminish the fond memories of a by-gone era; only makes one recognize that we cannot stand in the way of progress.

In the last edition [Summer, 2000] of the alumni newsletter there was a photo of **Ral Donner** (1960) and **Rick Terry** (1960) in their Norwood Park little league uniforms. The accompanying letter from (late '50s Taft baseball great) **Lynn Terry** (June 1957) on the tragic premature deaths of both Ral Donner and his younger brother Rick was both a wonderful tribute and a touching eulogy.

His letter had special meaning for me since I was fortunate enough to have known both Rick and Ral quite well. I first met each of them when we played together on that same little league team back in the summer of 1954. The team was Colorado Springs (see photo). And, we finished in last place.

Since I went to a different grammar school, it wasn't until I got to Taft, a few years later, that I bumped into my old baseball teammates once again.

Ral (Ralph) Donner was already Mr. Rock 'n Roll. He dressed sharp, looked cool and he sang exactly like Elvis. He was 15 and he already had sideburns! He was threatened almost daily by **Miss Marquardt**, "Cut those sideburns off or you'll be expelled!"

Rick Terry, on the other hand, was one of the funniest guys I ever knew. And, he became one of my favorite high school "greaser" buddies. Sadly, he also became the first friend -- I mean, a guy I actually knew -- to lose his young life. I'll never forget it.

Rick was only 17 when he was killed in a car accident. Ral Donner succumbed to cancer at age 41. I am saddened by both their deaths to this day.

"Where Are They Now? - Jim Jacobs"

Jim Jacobs [1960], co-creator of the longest running show in Broadway history, says that he is one alumnus whose life definitely changed for the better because he attended a Chicago public school.

Jacobs said that his experiences at William Howard Taft High School were the motivation behind "Grease," which, in addition to being the king of Broadway is also the biggest box office movie-musical of all time. The first version of "Grease," which Jacobs co-created in 1971 with the late Warren Casey, was a modest stage production at the Kingston Mines Theatre in Chicago.

Jacobs was acting on his high school dream of becoming an actor and a rock-n-roll star when he began composing "Grease" on his guitar and brought his ideas to Casev.

Those first performances were the catalyst for the book, music, and lyrics of "Grease," which eventually launched the careers of actors such as John Travolta, Richard Gere, Patrick Swayze, and Marilu Henner.

Jacobs said that "Grease" is based on a time when his live for music was being nourished at Taft, 6545 W. Hurlbut St.

"I had a great teacher who taught me more about classical music than anyone else, and then on Fridays he was hip enough to let us bring our own music," Jacobs said. "Mr. Compton was his name, and he was great. He didn't have any fear of art."

With that support, Jacobs began playing guitar and singing in several rock bands. However, Jacobs said that while his music interest flourished, his academics lagged behind.

"My focus wasn't there," he admitted. "It was funny, because my first year of high school I was really a superior to excellent student, but by my third year I was getting Fs and Ds."

Jacobs said he eventually did well enough to pass his classes, and shortly after graduating in 1960 he landed a job as a Chicago Tribune office boy. It was there that he met a community theater director.

"He said, 'Why don't you come and see a play,' and I kind of stumbled into it from there," Jacobs said humbly of his career.

He then began working as an actor and writer in community theaters and later landed the title role in the Midwest premiere of "Jimmy Shine" and a Broadway role in the Pulitzer Prize-winning play "No Place to Be Somebody: in 1971.

Jacobs also co-authored several other plays and musicals, including "Castaways - Island of Lost Coeds," "Bats in the Belfrey" and "Remember the Night."

Now, Jacobs has placed his main focus on promoting the worldwide resurgence of "Grease" and spending time with his wife, actress, singer and dancer Denise Nettleton.

He also tries to keep up with the current events at the real Rydell High - Taft High School, and recently attended his 40th class reunion.

"I had the best time of my life," he said of his days at Taft in the 1950s. "Those truly were 'Happy Days' for me."
