In a magnanimous gesture, the Taft Alumni Association Executive Board voted to award a record five scholarships for the class of 2003. A special \$200 scholarship, donated by the Taft class of 1967 was awarded to **Tzviatko Chiderov**. Arriving in the United States from Bulgaria in April 2000, he quickly assimilated into his studies and became a member of the National Honor Society and graduated with six departmental awards, including one from the English Department. Considering he knew only a few basic phrases in English when he came to this country, he was most proud of that award. **Tzviatko** plans to attend the University of Illinois at Chicago, majoring in computer science. He is particularly interested in web design and computer programming.

Beating Drums to Retirement

Ending a thirty-four year career with the Chicago Public Schools, Taft Steel Band director Lloyd Hoover retired this June. Hoover transferred to Taft from Clemente High School in 1995 and shortly formed a new band at Taft — with steel drums. The program gained popularity quickly and many concerts were highly attended over the next several years. His last official performance was with his students during the Taft International Festival in June. Since steel drums are very unique instruments, this part of the Taft music program will most likely retire with Mr. Hoover. No other teacher at Taft is qualified to carry on this program. The drums will probably be sold.

What a Difference...

The year is 1903 ... one hundred years ago ... what a difference a century makes! Here are some of the US statistics for 1903:

- The average life expectancy in the US was 47 years.
- Only 14% of the homes in the US had a bathtub.
- Only 8% of the homes had a telephone.
- A 3-minute call (Denver to NYC) cost \$11.
- There were only 8,000 cars in the US, and only 144 miles of paved roads.
- The max. speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.
- Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa, and Tennessee were each more heavily populated than California. With a mere 1.4 million residents, California was only the 21st-most populous state in the Union.
- The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.
- The average wage in the US was 22-cents/hour.
- The average US worker made between \$200 and \$400 per year.
- A competent accountant could expect to earn \$2000 per year, a dentist \$2,500 per year, a veterinarian between \$1,500 and \$4,000 per year, and a mechanical engineer about \$5,000 per year.
- More than 95% of all births in the US took place at home.
- 90% of US physicians had no college education.
- Instead, they attended medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press and by the government as "substandard."
- Sugar cost four-cents/pound. Eggs were fourteen cents a dozen. Coffee, fifteen cents/pound.
- Most women only washed their hair once a month, and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.
- Canada passed a law prohibiting poor people from entering the country for any reason.
- The five leading causes of death in the US were:
 - 1. Pneumonia and influenza
 - 2. Tuberculosis
 - 3. Diarrhea
 - 4. Heart disease
 - 5. Stroke
- The American flag had 45 stars. Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii, and Alaska hadn't been admitted to the Union yet.
- The population of Las Vegas, Nevada, was 30.
- Crossword puzzles, canned beer, and iced tea hadn't been invented.
- There was no Mother's Day or Father's Day.
- One in ten US adults couldn't read or write. Only 6% of all Americans had graduated high school.
- Marijuana, heroin, and morphine were all available over the counter at corner drugstores. According to one pharmacist, "Heroin clears the complexion, gives buoyancy to the mind, regulates the stomach and the bowels, and is, in fact, a perfect guardian of health."
- 18% of households in the US had at least one full-time servant or domestic.
- There were only about 230 reported murders in the entire US.

Security is Serious Business

Although metal detectors were not a new item at Taft. a new directive was implemented this spring, thanks to heightened security throughout the country. seldom-used equipment that stood at the main doors will now be used every school day. Beginning on June 6, 2003, all students are required to pass through the metal detectors. If something in a student's backpack, purse or other package sets off the alarm, a second scan will be performed on that student with a hand-held wand or, if necessary, searched by hand. Of the over 1700 students that attend Taft each day, early reports of irregularities being brought into the school were small. The biggest infraction was with cell phones. At Taft, cell phones are not allowed, and are considered contraband. When confiscated, parents must retrieve the phones.
